RE: Health Facility Licensure Impact Due to Public Act 209 of 2023

To Whom It May Concern:

With the passage and signing of Public Act 209 of 2023 by the Michigan Legislature and Governor Gretchen Whitmer, respectively, effective February 13, 2024, Freestanding Outpatient Surgical Facilities (FSOF) that were required to be licensed under MCL 333.20115 will no longer be licensed.

The FSOF health facility license issued by the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs, (LARA), Bureau of Community and Health Systems (BCHS), for Scotsdale Women's Center (836002) is no longer required by law as of February 13, 2024, and is not considered valid. Additionally, Scotsdale Women's Center (836002) is no longer eligible for renewal of a facility license issued by LARA BCHS under the criteria of former MCL 333.20115(2). The Department requests that the license for Scotsdale Women's Center (836002) be removed from public display and is either shredded or properly disposed of.

Practitioners and their associated medical staff can continue to provide healthcare services at the same location. However, these continued services will be provided under the individual's respective license issued by the Bureau of Professional Licensing (BPL).

Finally, although not required, any group that would like to seek a facility license in the future for the provision of surgical services beyond the criteria set forth in the former MCL 333.20115(2) must first begin by contacting the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHSS) Certificate of Need (CON) Section to obtain approvals before LARA can consider an application for licensure.
